Mountjoy Square Community Charter

All of us who live in, work in and love Mountjoy Square have the right to be considered part of the Mountjoy Square community.

Members of Mountjoy Square community are entitled to a positive and supportive attitude from Dublin City Council in the upkeep and improvement of Mountjoy Square and Park.

We have the right to expect that Mountjoy Square Park will be improved – that it will be developed into a safe and attractive green space that realises its full potential and is managed with our needs as a community in mind.

We have the right to be consulted in plans for the development of the Park and informed by Dublin City Council on its management and upkeep.

In our own right and as part of the wider North Inner City, we want to be regarded as integral to the area. We are entitled to decent public spaces and municipal services and look to be supported as a substantially residential community by city planners, Dublin City Council officials, and the politicians who serve this area, national and local.

Every one who visits and uses Mountjoy Square Park has the right to the respect of all those who also enjoy it.

Every one who visits and uses Mountjoy Square Park has the responsibility to ensure that their individual enjoyment of the Park does not affect others' enjoyment.
